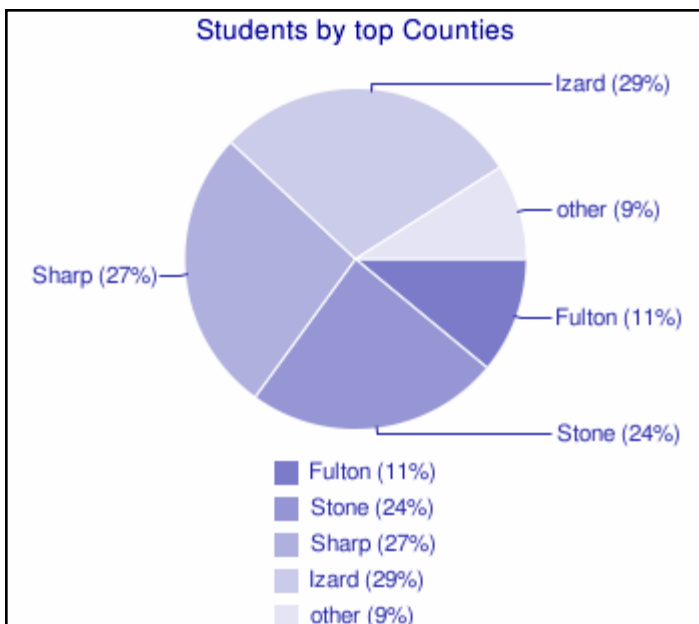

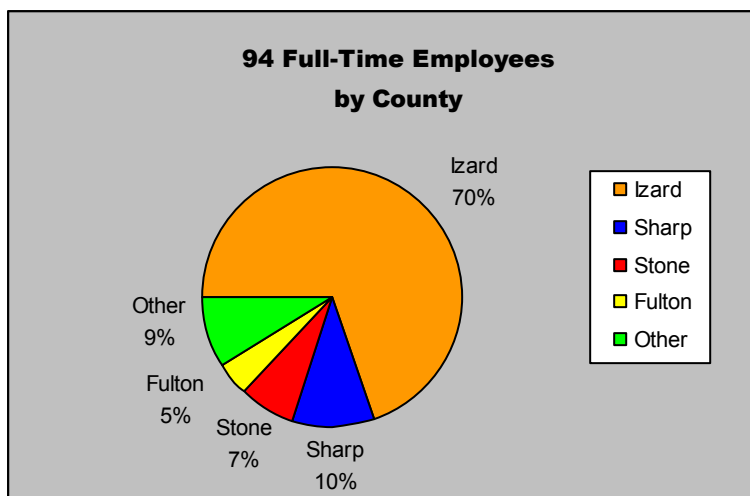


OZARKA COLLEGE MISSION STATEMENT

OZARKA STATISTICS

- Ozarka College service area includes four counties, Fulton, Izard, Sharp, and Stone
 - Estimated population: 54,500
 - Total area: 2,420.11 square miles
- Average income per capita in service area: \$21,751
 - State of Arkansas average: \$28,473
 - National average: \$36,714
- Population below poverty level: 18%-20%, depending on county
 - State of Arkansas average: 16%
 - National Average: 12.7%
- 11% of service area population has a Bachelor's degree or higher
 - State of Arkansas average: 18%
 - National average: 24%
- Ozarka has a 15:1 student to faculty ratio
- Ozarka students average age: 31 years old
- Ozarka students are 71% female, 29% male
